



JEANNIE'S RECIPE CORNER





Directions:

- To make the filling, combine fruits in a saucepan and cook. covered, medium
- Heat for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- Add lemon juice, sugar, and cornstarch. Cook for 5 minutes or until thickened. Cool.
- To make cake, combine flour, sugar, baking powder, and salt in a large bowl
- Cut in butter until mixture is crumbly.
- Beat together buttermilk, eggs, and vanilla:, add to the flour mixture.
- Spread one-half of the batter in a greased 13-inch x 9-inch baking pan. Spread fruit mixture over batter.
- Spoon the remaining batter in small mounds on top of the filling. Mix topping ingredients until crumbly; sprinkle over all.
- Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes.
- Serve slightly warm.

Yield: 12-16 servings. You could also add a little whipped cream.
