### Old Home Days in New Hampshire

Since its inception over 100 years ago, Old Home Day has continued to be faithfully observed in towns throughout the Granite State.

Governor Frank Rollins developed the concept in 1899 to invite former residents of New Hampshire home at a time when the opening of the West, and lure of urban centers with industrial jobs had depleted New Hampshire's rural areas. "Towns that had had boasted as many as 2,000 were reduced to under 100, farmhouses were falling into ruin, fields were growing back to brush, and forests were being clear-cut," according to Tom Curran in his overview of Old House Days produced for the Preservation Alliance. It was a "family reunion at a grand, Victorian scale,"

Did you know that the Parade Grounds were originally used for the military and a site for a church? Drills and inspections were held in May and September, by one or more companies, so long as the New Hampshire military system existed.

This system required service for all competent males between the ages of 18 and 45 years of age.

The last official military use of the Parade was for the muster of the NH National Guard. The troops marched to the train station and boarded a train to Hoboken, NJ. From there, they departed for Europe and Word War I, becoming part of the US Army Yankee Division in 1917.


**Alcoholics Anonymous meetings** are held Tuesday evenings at 7 PM at the Center Barnstead Christian Church.



# **JEANNIE'S RECIPE CORNER**



Directions:

- Mix with milk to bring it altogether, pour into greased pan (8"x8" or 9"x9")
- Cover with 1/2 t0 3/4 cup blueberries, 1 cup of sugar and 1 cup of water.
- Bake at 350 degrees for 25 to 30 minutes.
- The cake will rise up thru the blueberries and you will have a sauce in the bottom of the pan.
- Serve warm with whipped cream or ice cream.

Blueberries are nothing new—native to North America they have been part of ife here for 13,000 years. The first high bush blueberry's were cultivated in the early 1900's. The native berry's (small ones) are sweet and delicate and very delicious.

There are over one billion pounds of blueberries in North America produced for commercial production each year
